The Pre-school children are loving Wild Things Forest School on a Wednesday morning. They have the opportunity to explore a wooded area, building dens looking for bugs and toasting marshmallows over an open fire, I think the practitioners enjoy it too.





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Pre-School

Renate has returned from Josephs to resume her position of Learning Manager/Early Years Teacher. We have lots of activities going on, with a new mud kitchen in the outdoor area, created by our friendly handy man. `Show & Tell ` is on Tuesday in January, we ask the children to bring in an object or memory to discuss in circle time, encouraging children to listen, discuss and share. Practitioners also introduce a different letter and word every week, inspiring children to explore a variety of sounds.

Toddlers

We have had new wooden flooring laid in the toddler room, so lots more messy play activities are being provided.
Practitioners have created a 'Time Line' display, along the stair well, showing photographic evidence of

the children at play at various times of the day. The Toddlers like to know what is happening next, and enjoy seeing themselves and their peers at play. We have been looking at our outdoor play area, planning to incorporate a storage area for toys and acquire a small shed for the children to explore.

Baby Room

The Babies have been busy baking and experiencing lots of sensory activities.
The next steps for each child has been working exceptionally well with parents supporting the children's learning at home.

The Baby room team have requested that parents bring in a box from home with a variety of photographs of their child's family/friends and resources that their child is interested in, to share at nursery.
