Training

The Super Sunflowers have benefitting more dedicated pre-school time. They have been able to use the scissors more and have been learning how to write their names. We now have Self Registration Post Box. On arrival please can you encourage your child/children to find their photo with their name on it and to post it in the box.



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This will support the children in recognising their names. They have also been baking up to twice a week and have loved trying new foods and making their own snacks.

Occupancy

The nursery occupancy is increasing. We have limited availability in the Under 2's room, but more availability in the Over 2's room from September.

Please can I remind you all that the notice period for leaving or reducing sessions is **2** months written notice.

30 hours' funding

If you are eligible for 30 hours' funding, please remember to log onto your

account every 3 months to confirm your eligibility. If you don't log in it will affect us being able to claim funding for your child.

Bags, Toys, food & drink from home

We have a number of children with food allergies in our nursery so please do not bring in food from home unless it is the Under 2's bottled milk. As we do have a number of children with different allergies. If your child has missed their breakfast then we do have lots of different food here that they can choose from.

Winter Clothes

Please can you bring your child to nursery with a warm labelled winter coat and hat and gloves if necessary. We aim to visit our Forest School as much as possible so a pair of wellies would be good too as we do not have many spare at nursery.
